Regional Summary:

- COVID-19 cases
 - Guam has reported 7,812 total cases and 136 deaths with 16 new cases and 2 new deaths reported this week
 - CNMI has reported 159 total cases and 2 deaths with 0 new cases reported this week
 - RMI has reported 4 total cases identified in mandatory quarantine on Kwajalein military base (all imported, and all recovered)
 - American Samoa, FSM, and Palau remain COVID-free
- COVID-19 Vaccine distribution summary (See USAPI Vaccine Summary Figures, 7 updated tables and figures listed below)
 - All USAPI residents age 18+ are now eligible for vaccine (age 16+ for AS, Guam, CNMI)
 - CDC is actively shipping Pfizer (AS, CNMI, Guam), Moderna (all USAPI), and J-3 (all USAPI) into the region with first and second doses
 - April allocation adjusted to “Finish Line” doses and ordering has begun
 - April and May orders will provide enough vaccine for 100% of 18+ in all USAPI
 - 269,580 doses of Pfizer and Moderna, plus 3,700 J-3 doses have been delivered to the USAPI in total (enough vaccine to fully vaccinate 138,490 people)
 - A total of 82,893 people in the region are fully vaccinated (28% of all adults 18+ in the region)
 - An additional 44,578 people in the region are partially vaccinated (15% of all adults in the region)
 - Palau and CNMI are currently using J3 vaccine (other USAPI still planning for use upon arrival)
 - External Federal teams have assisted in Palau (completed) and CNMI (on-going)
 - Other jurisdictions slowed down this week and are considering external assistance
 - Vaccine demand remains strong, but there are some indications that demand may be slowing down somewhat
 - CDC teams working with USAPI to help counter vaccine hesitancy and misinformation
 - USAPI are using novel private partnerships for delivery methods and community incentives
- COVID-19 Containment strategies
 - Guam and CNMI are allowing travelers to enter with facility quarantine and testing requirements
 - Palau is allowing essential air service flights from Taiwan and military flights with testing and quarantine requirements
 - American Samoa currently has residents in quarantine in Honolulu for its fifth repatriation flight on 4/15
 - RMI currently has residents in quarantine in Hawaii for its fifth repatriation flight and will continue with monthly flights
 - FSM repatriation is on hold until 70% of the population has been vaccinated
- COVID-19 Laboratory Testing capacity
 - All USAPI have at least Abbott ID NOW, Abbott Binax NOW, and GeneXpert capacity
 - There are currently adequate stocks of tests in the region
- Community mitigation strategies
 - Guam is in PCOR-3 and continues to relax mitigation measures
 - CNMI, American Samoa, FSM, Palau, and RMI have relaxed most or all mitigation measures
- PPE
 - All USAPI have a stockpile of PPE for COVID-19, though quantities vary

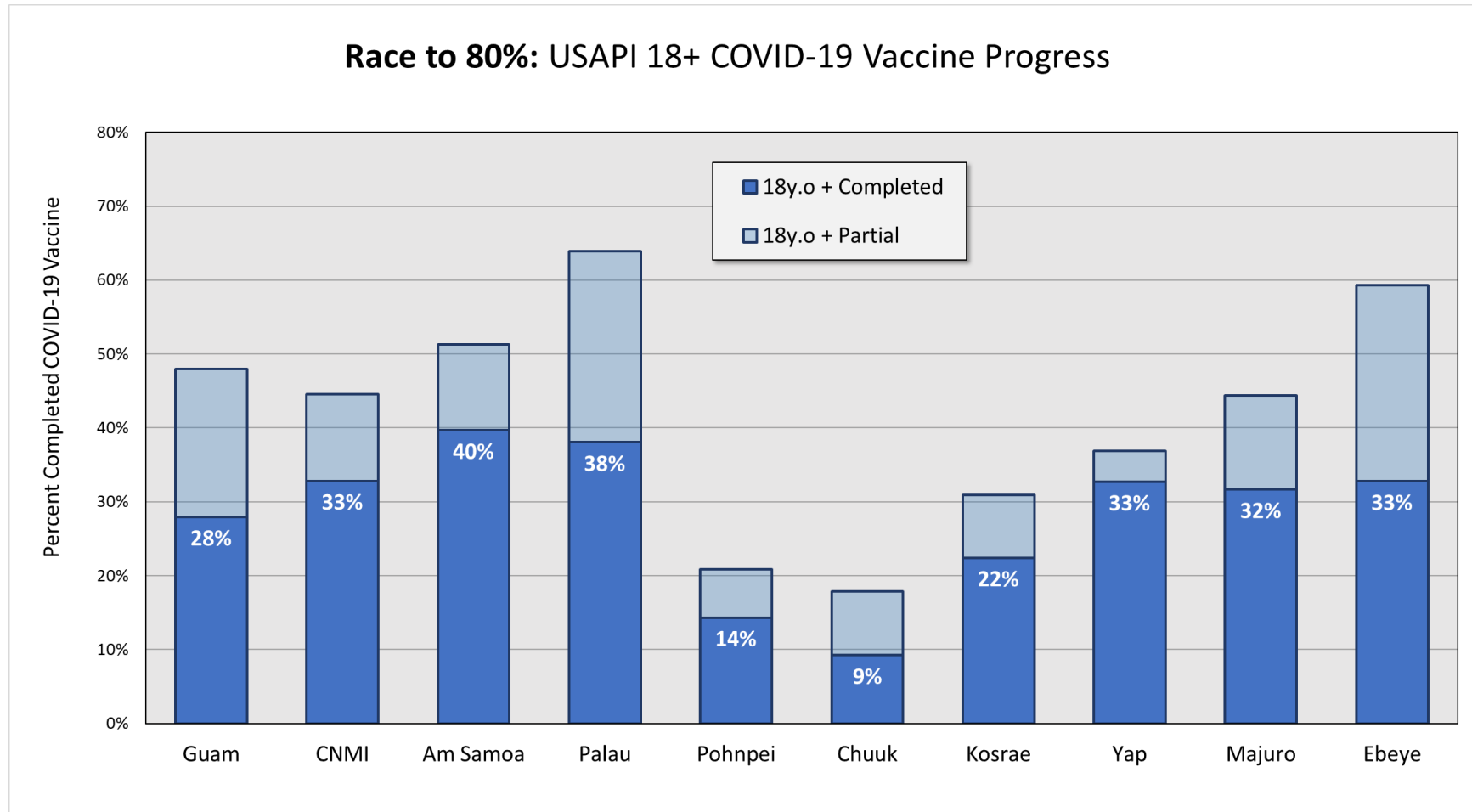

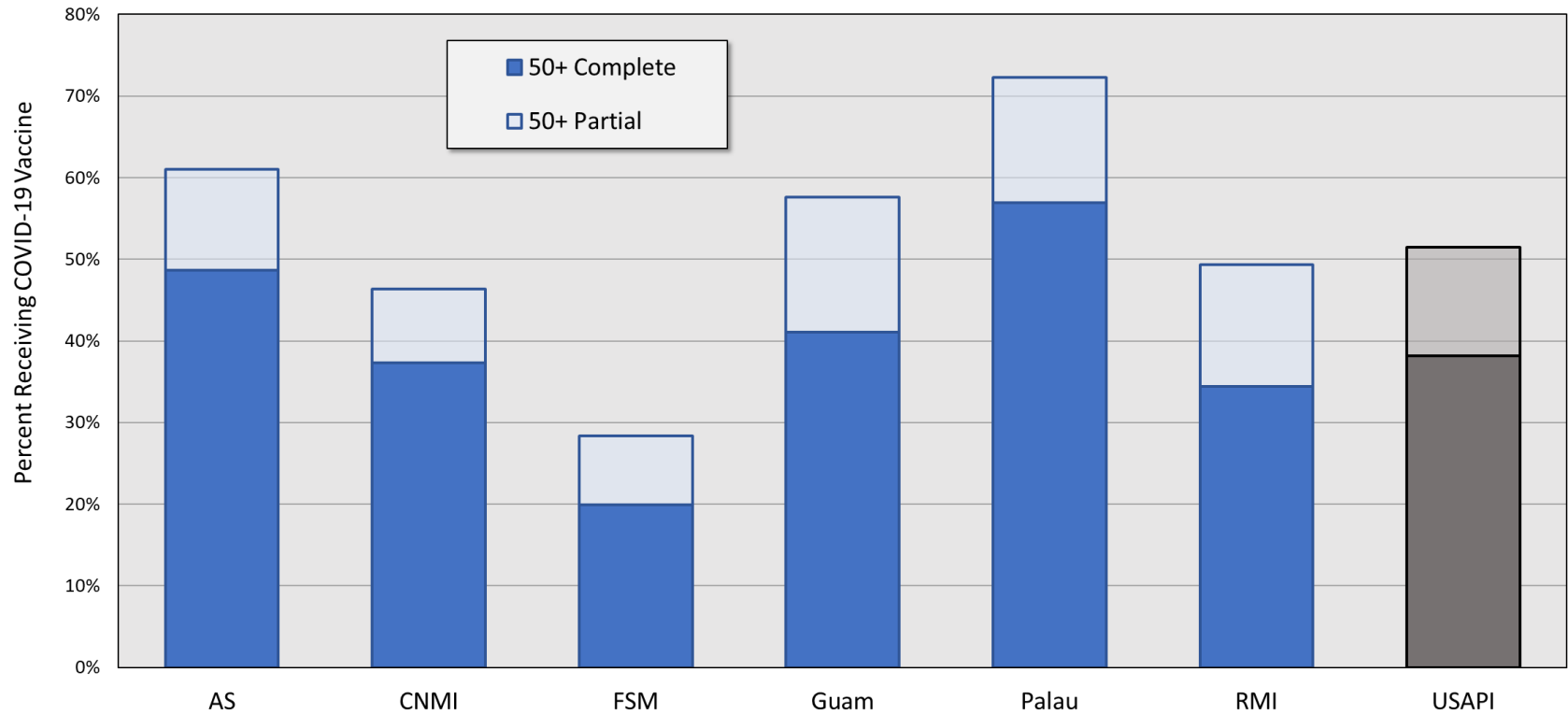
2. "Race to 80%": Percent of population 18+ who have had at least one vaccine dose (as of 04/02/2021)

3. Vaccine targets for USAPI Region (as of 03/20/2021)

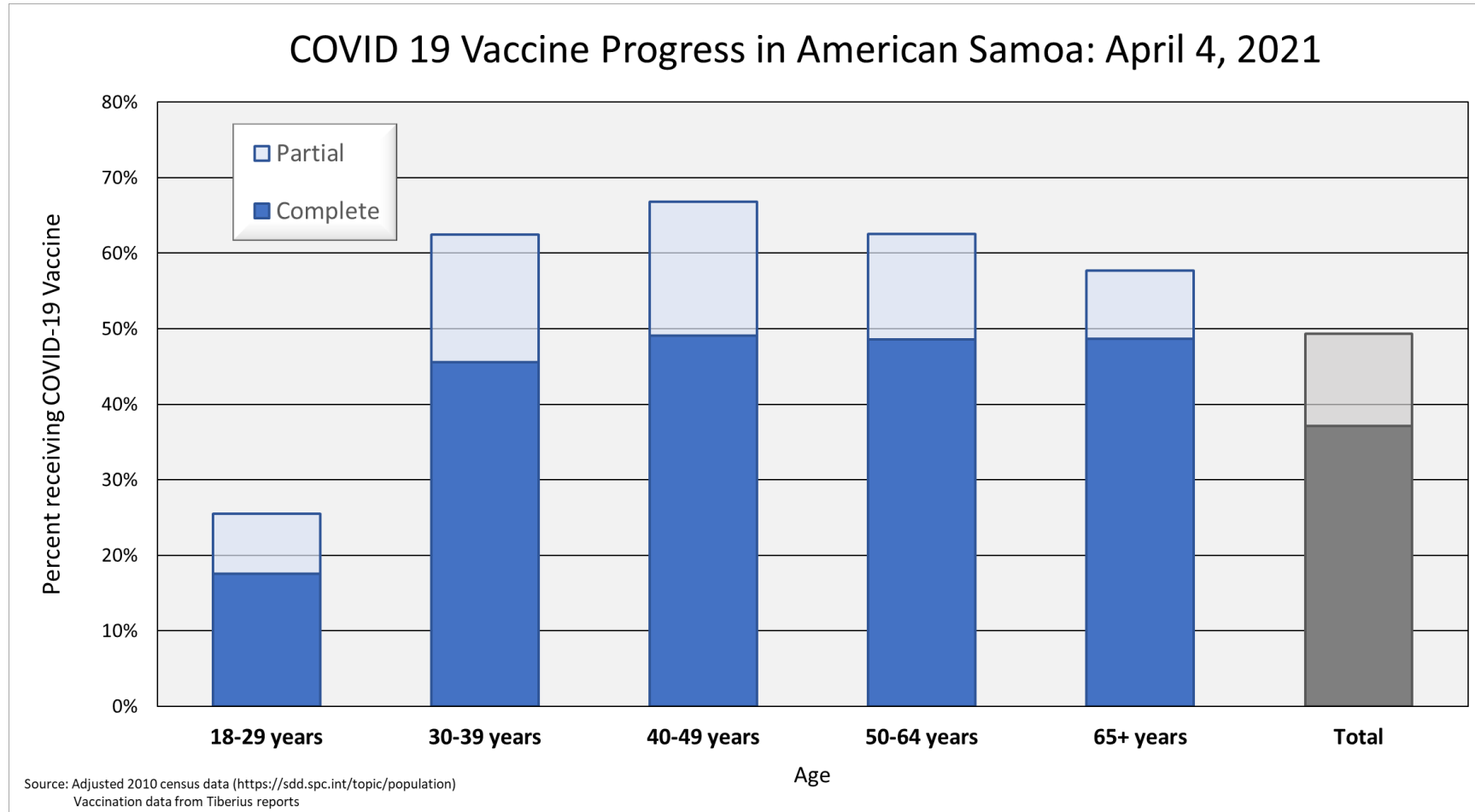
USAPI COVID-19 Vaccine Progress: 50 years and older (April 4,2021)



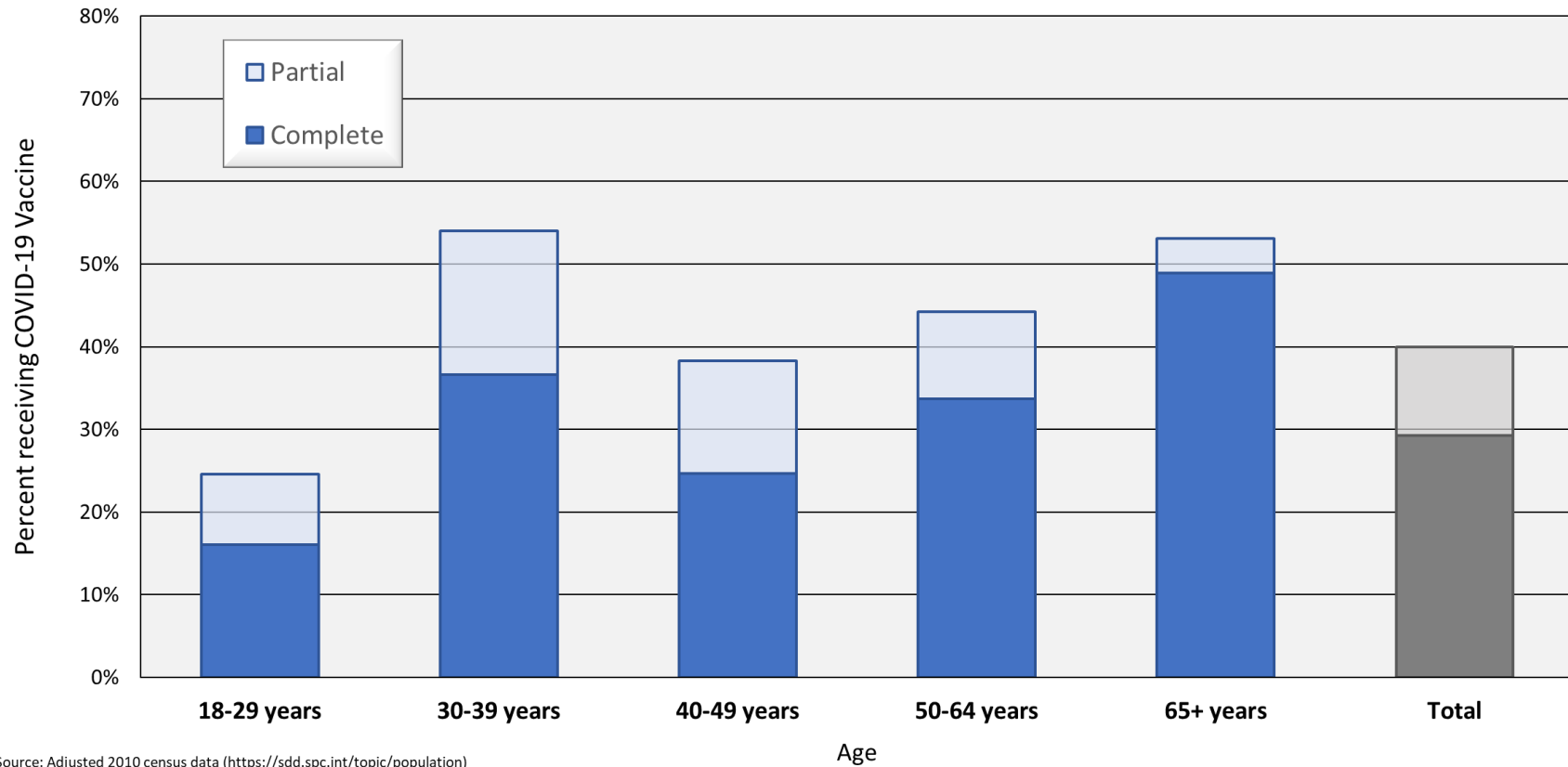

4. Vaccine Delivery to High-Risk Individuals in USAPI Jurisdictions (as of 04/04/2021)



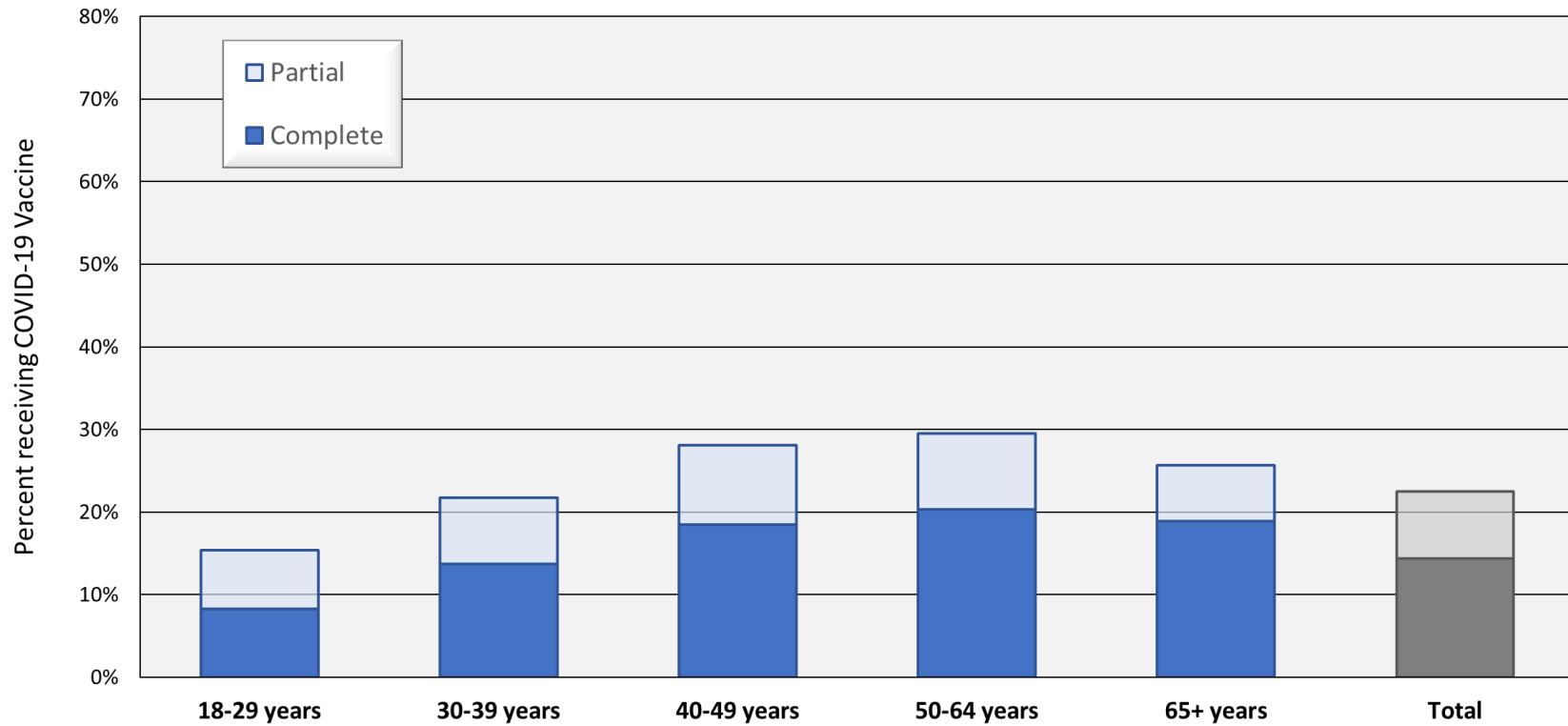
COVID 19 Vaccine Progress in CNMI: April 4, 2021

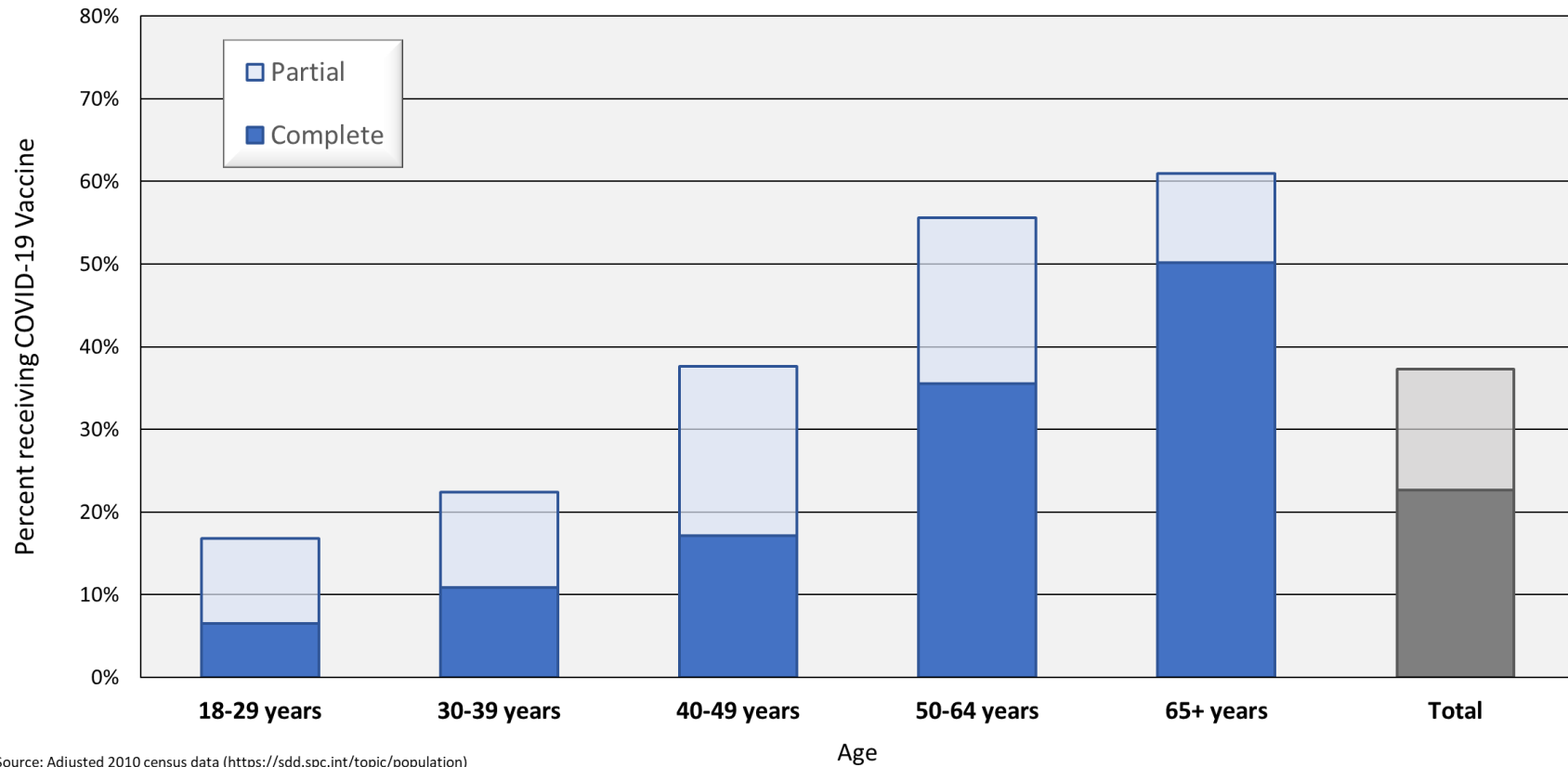

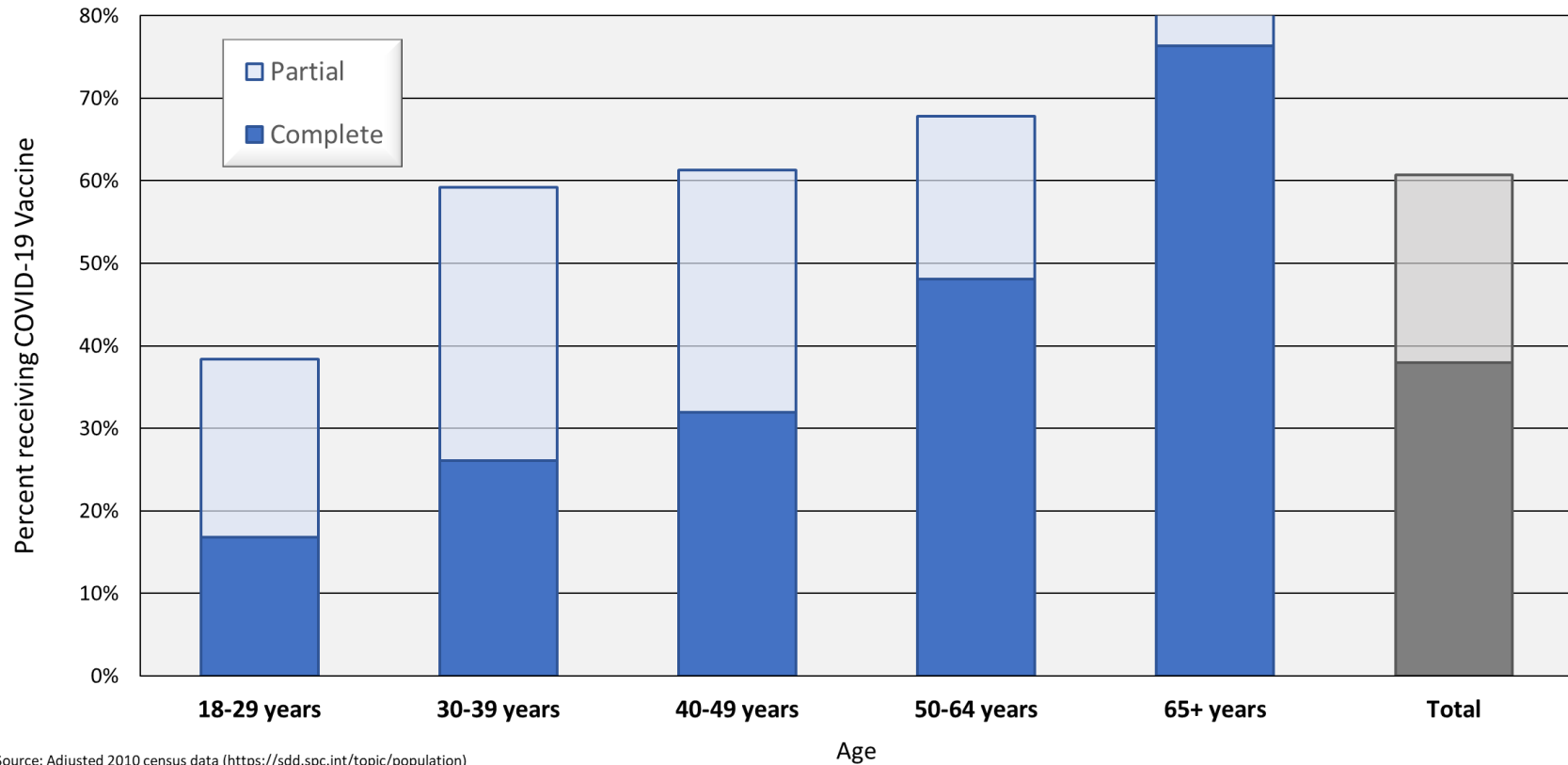
COVID 19 Vaccine Progress in Guam: April 4, 2021

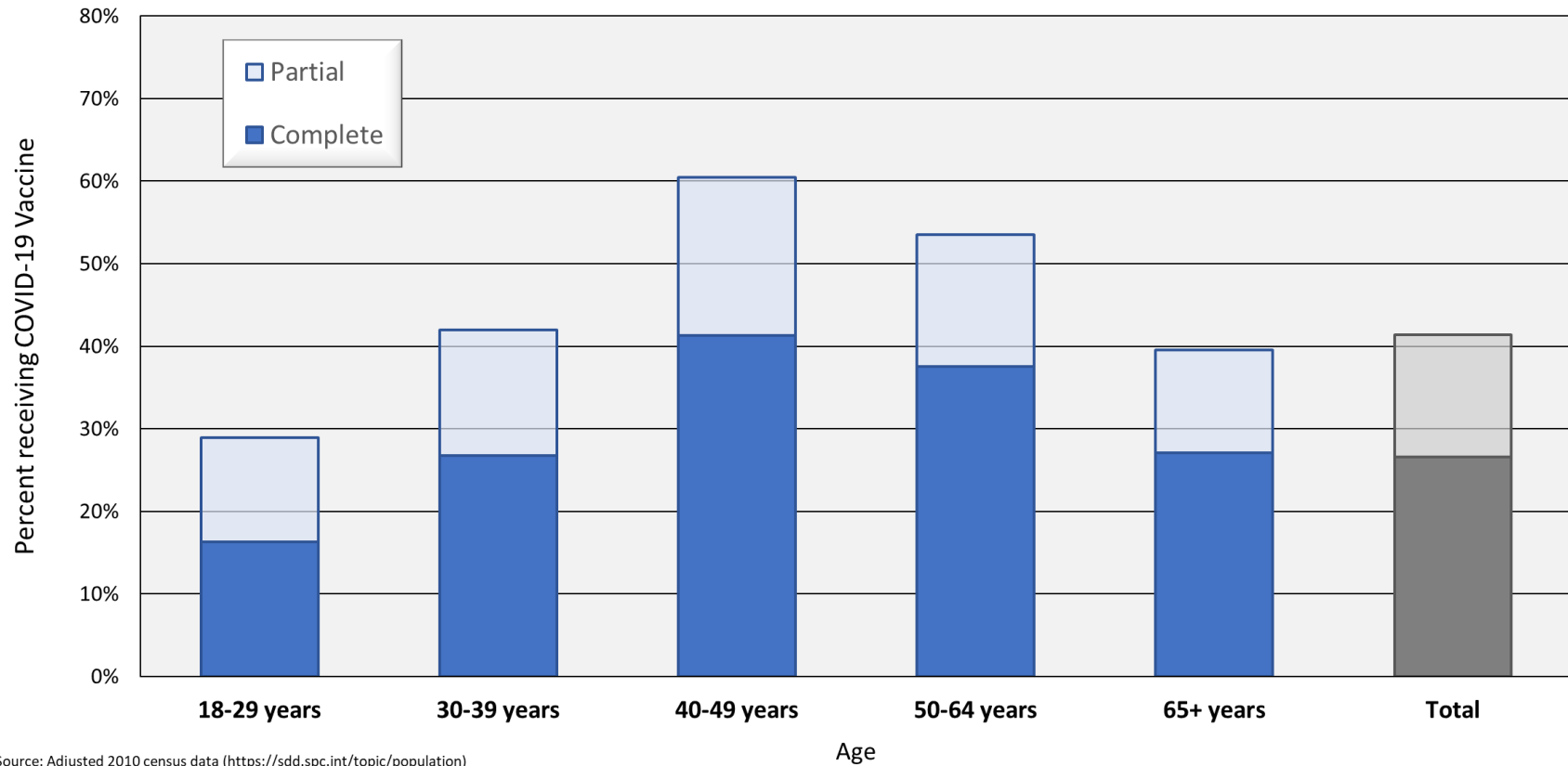

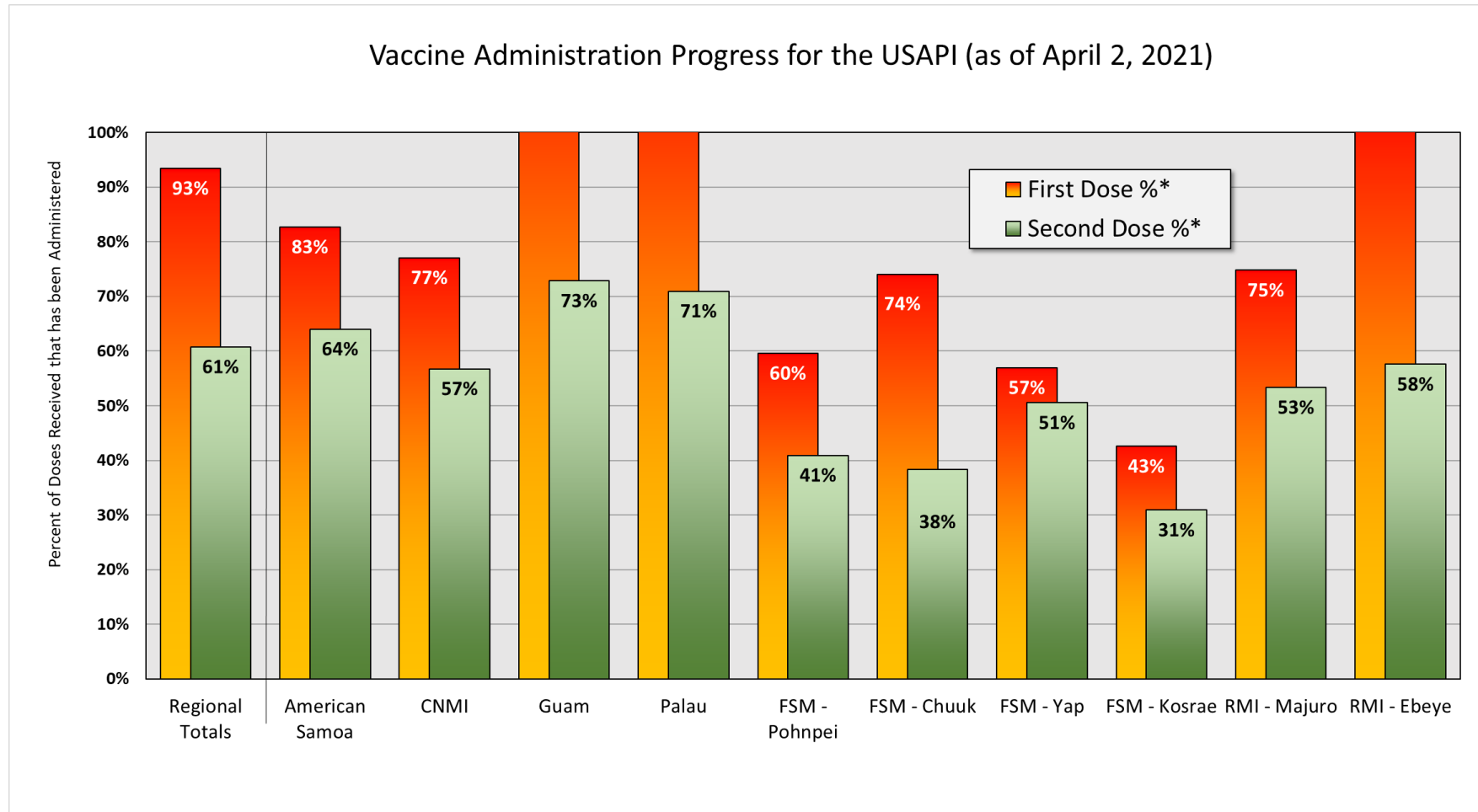
