Regional Summary:

- Testing capability is improving but still limited
 - All USAPI now have testing capacity on-island
 - o Small numbers of tests available on-island
 - There is a need for additional lab supplies (especially swabs and VTM)
 - Request for guidance on testing algorithms
- Concerns with medical surge
 - o Lack of equipment (ventilators)
 - Lack of trained staff to use ventilators and lack of training on ventilator maintenance
 - Lack of supplies- oxygen tanks, oxygen respiratory delivery supplies, medication, cots, etc.
 - o Questions on what medical supplies that need to be ordered (specifically drugs)
 - Challenges with procurement (relatively small orders, global shortages, slow procurement processes locally)
 - o Some USAPI have old and unreliable oxygen generators
 - o Limited staff, especially nurses, respiratory technicians, and laboratory technicians
 - Request for clinical training on COVID-19 patient management
 - o Considerations of training non-health staff
- Technological challenges
 - Limited use of telehealth on-island
 - Concerns with IT infrastructure for on/off-island telemedicine
- Transportation challenges
 - \circ $\,$ Many USAPI have stranded residents that want to return home $\,$
 - o Request for TA on quarantine protocols for travelers
 - Challenges receiving shipments from donors (inventory, storage, customs release, forwarding to other islands)
- Lack of PPE
 - o Need for inventory systems and calculating burn rates
 - Request for guidance or protocols for PPE preservation and reuse
- Issues with social distancing
 - Some jurisdictions are not implementing social distancing measures or very limited social distancing measures
 - o Challenges with lack of compliance and enforcement
 - o Request for community assessment tools and TA on risk communication
