### Regional Summary:

- Testing capacity has improved
  - All USAPI have at least Abbott ID NOW and GeneXpert running
  - Adequate test stocks for now, but no confirmed long-term pipeline for tests, although more shipments expected through July
  - There are many questions on antibody tests and a need for clear guidelines and evidence
- Many USAPI are not prepared for case management and contact investigation
  - TA is ongoing from multiple partners to develop protocols, forms, and systems
  - TA is ongoing from multiple partners to conduct tabletop exercises to test systems
- Clinical management training and preparation remains a gap
  - Clinical training (CME) over Zoom (patient management, ventilation, etc.) will hopefully begin next week
  - Request for 24/7 hotline for clinical questions
  - Request for simple guidelines on patient management
  - Concerns regrading medical staff safety and mental health
- Adequate ventilators are now in the USAPI, but there are still challenges getting these to be functional
  - Many ventilators ordered by the USAPI are missing components
  - Unclear how FEMA vents work with oxygen cylinders (need to figure out how to make this work)
  - Lack of biomedical engineers in the region
  - Unclear what additional components are needed for ventilators (circuits, tubing, etc.)
  - Request for guidance on maintenance and cleaning of ventilators and potential reuse of tubing
- Many USAPI are struggling with repatriation of residents
  - Request for TA on quarantine protocols for travelers
  - Need to test these protocols and make certain that adequate facilities and other resources are in place prior to repatriation, and that quarantine is conducted properly
- PPE stocks have been established but challenges remain
  - No long-term pipeline established and many USAPI still have inadequate stocks
  - Need for inventory systems to calculate burn rates and concerns about high burn rates in some USAPI
  - Request for guidance or protocols for PPE preservation and reuse and PPE use training
- Many USAPI do not have long-term plans with containment and mitigation strategies
- Other concerns:
  - Technological issues and lack of IT infrastructure in many of the USAPI
  - Challenges balancing COVID-19 response and delivery of other health programs
