Regional Summary:

- COVID-19 cases
 - Guam has 2,617 total cases and 49 deaths with 331 new cases and 10 new deaths reported this week; weekly case count
 increased this week
 - CNMI has 73 total cases and 2 deaths with 4 new cases reported this week (all imported) and no new deaths
 - o American Samoa, FSM, Palau, and RMI remain COVID-free
- Testing capacity
 - All USAPI have at least Abbott ID NOW and GeneXpert capacity
 - Abbott BinaxNOW will soon be supplied to the USAPI
 - There are currently adequate stocks of tests in the region
- Containment strategies
 - Guam and CNMI are allowing travelers to enter with quarantine and testing requirements
 - Palau has completed repatriation and is allowing "essential air service" flights from Taiwan and military flights with testing and quarantine requirements
 - American Samoa has completed repatriation from Samoa and planning is ongoing to repatriate from Honolulu
 - o RMI has repatriated from COVID-free countries, and will conduct their first repatriation flight from Honolulu on 10/31
 - o FSM is focusing on planning for repatriation from COVID-free countries (beginning with RMI)
- Community mitigation strategies
 - o Guam continues to be in "PCOR-1" (strictest level)
 - o CNMI has relaxed social distancing measures and most businesses are now open
 - o American Samoa, FSM, Palau, and RMI are focusing on education and living normally
- Vaccine Preparedness
 - All USAPI are currently developing mass COVID-19 vaccination campaign plans with CDC support while planning and implementing mass influenza vaccination campaigns
 - o PIHOA is requesting federal consideration for 100% vaccine allotment for USAPI
 - o Palau has decided not to participate in the COVAX initiative as a self-pay country
- PPE
 - o All USAPI have a stockpile of PPE for COVID-19, though quantities vary
 - o Need for inventory systems to calculate burn rates, monitor consumption, and track distribution
