Regional Summary:

- COVID-19 cases
 - Guam has reported 19,239 total cases and 266 deaths with 84 new cases (↓ from 94 last week) and 3 new deaths reported this week (↑ from 1 new death last week); test positivity 2.1% (↓ from 2.8% last week)
 - CNMI has reported 1,062 total cases and 3 deaths; 413 new cases (↑ from 218 last week) and 0 new deaths this week (-- from 0 new deaths last week); cases identified from community-based testing and contact tracing; widespread community transmission ongoing
 - o American Samoa has reported 10 total cases (all imported) with 5 new cases reported this week, all identified in travel quarantine
 - o Palau has reported 8 total cases (6 travelers in restricted movement, 2 contacts) with 0 new cases this week; no community transmission
 - o FSM and RMI have had no community transmission
- COVID-19 Vaccine distribution summary (See USAPI Vaccine Summary with 25 updated tables and figures listed below)
 - Pediatric formulation of the Pfizer vaccine was ordered and delivered to each of the 6 USAPI, pediatric vaccination campaigns have started in American Samoa, CNMI, Guam, Majuro and Palau
 - Based on jurisdictional reports: a total of 266,000 people in the region are fully vaccinated (76.4% of all eligible individuals /-1.4%/ 5-11-year-olds in Palau and Majuro now eligible to receive vaccination)
 - An additional 20,000 people in the region are partially vaccinated (5.7% of eligible individuals in the region)
 - Note: eligible individuals are 5+ for American Samoa, CNMI, Guam, Majuro and Palau 12+ for Kosrae, Yap, Kwajalein and RMI Outer Islands – 18+ for Chuuk and Pohnpei
 - Based on data submitted into Tiberius via WeblZ: 77% of all people aged 5 years and older have had at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine; 68% are fully vaccinated. This percentage includes Pohnpei and Chuuk (FSM) who have yet to start vaccinating adolescents or children.
 - Current percentages of eligible population aged 5 and over fully vaccinated (with change from last week's data in parenthesis are blank due to the expanded eligible population):
 - American Samoa: 73% (+1%)
 - FSM: Chuuk: 41% (+1%), Kosrae: 58% (+1%), Pohnpei: 48% (--%), Yap: 62% (+2%)
 - Guam: 80% (--%)
 RMI: 48% (--%)
 CNMI: 76% (+3%)
 Palau: 96% (+1%)
 - Outer island vaccinations: Outer Island coverage rates from jurisdictional outer island outreach activities due to difficulty in determining denominators and true residence in Tiberius.
 - RMI Outer Islands: At least one dose 53% (--%); Fully 45% (--%) (denominators adjusted based on OI reports and expanded to 12+)
 - Yap Outer Islands: At least one dose 98% (--%); Fully 95% (--%) (denominators adjusted to locally collected denominators for 18+)
 - Chuuk Outer Islands (out of the lagoon): Fully 31% (--%) (OI numbers are incomplete)
 - Pohnpei Outer Islands: Fully 63% (--%) (denominator adjusted based on OI reports for 18+)
 - Boosters: A total of 40,412 boosters/additional doses have been provided across the USAPI: American Samoa: 1,985; FSM: 1,430; Guam: 25,121; RMI: 637; CNMI: 8,135; Palau: 3,104
- COVID-19 Containment strategies
 - Guam is allowing vaccinated travelers or unvaccinated travelers with negative test 72 hours prior to arrival to enter without testing or quarantine.
 - CNMI is allowing vaccinated travelers with approval to enter without quarantine with testing on day 5 and unvaccinated travelers to enter with facility quarantine requirement with testing on day 7.
 - o Palau is running regular Guam flights with quarantine exemptions for vaccinated travelers (but with restricted movement) and testing on days 1&5.

- o RMI has regular repat flights ongoing with HNL/in-country quarantine and testing requirements.
- o AS is running HNL flights using "Talofa Pass" system with pre-travel testing and 10-day AS quarantine.
- o FSM continues smaller repat flights with Guam/FSM quarantine and testing requirements.
- COVID-19 Laboratory Testing capacity
 - Supplies of Abbott ID NOW, Abbott BinaxNOW, and GeneXpert are low in some USAPI as travel testing demands increase; difficulties with procurement.




